



Greetings from the birthplace of Agatha Christie!

We are so excited about this year's Festival, which is packed with treats for fans of both Agatha Christie and the genre of crime fiction in general.

Our Fringe Festival will again be taking full advantage of our unique ability to hold events in actual places with a tangible Christie connection. This year that includes All Saints' Church where she was baptised, the Royal Torbay Yacht Club where her father was a member, Paignton Zoo where she attended the 25th anniversary celebrations and several events at her former holiday home at Greenway.

We are also hosting a murder mystery on the steam train ridden by both Agatha herself, and Poirot in two of her novels. 2024 is also the 100th anniversary of The Man in the Brown Suit, and Kents Cavern (which appears at Hampsley Cavern) in the book, have a series of talks, special tours and even an Underground Cinema Festival.

The Literary Festival will be held in the Spanish Barn at Torre Abbey, with an impressive line-up of speakers who will be chatting about various aspects of Agatha's life and works, as well as wider aspects of the crime fiction genre. Opening our talks is a very special headline guest, Lynda La Plante.

The four-day Literary Festival closes with Ragnar Jónasson (Dark Iceland series) and Benjamin Stevenson (Everyone In My Family Has Killed Someone) chatting to Jake Kerridge about their love of Agatha Christie and her influences on their work.

New for 2024 is the Lunchtime Murder Club and your chance to take part in free and social activities, from guizzes to bingo and a book club to a game of Cluedo. Our new partners, East Gate Bookshop, in Totnes will be running our pop-up bookshop.
